Distance Learning Technical School

The first week of the Distance Learning Technical School will run from Monday 9th September to Friday 13th September and the second week will run from Monday 16th September to Friday 20th September. Your sessions will run from approximately 10am to 5pm each day but a confirmed timetable will be shared with you in mid-August.

Please arrive at 9.30am on Monday 9th September and ensure you have completed your enrolment by Thursday 5th September to ensure you can receive your student card and can access our systems on your first day. Enrolment information will be sent to you in mid-August via email.

Your timetable

Your timetable is likely to include a combination of on-campus studio practice, practical projects, experimentation and development of production work, technical workshops and online interactive lectures, seminars, small group tutorials, 1:1 tutorials, online crits, studio briefs and much more. In a typical week you will be allocated time on campus for practice based teaching, seminars, technical delivery, making and experimentation, as well as time for self initiated and self directed practice as part of our extended studio model. You will be able to book into our studios, IT Suites and base rooms to make work, as well as engage in Workshop Wednesdays and book technical support from our technical teams.
