The new term starts with Induction week on **Monday 2 September**, we're looking forward to welcoming you to **Palace Studios on Buckwell Street** and will be in touch throughout the summer with further updates.

If you are waiting for your results, we wish you the best of luck on results day. It's very important that we receive your results as soon as possible so we can make sure that there is no delay in confirming your place.

From Thursday 15 August your results can be submitted by emailing <u>results@aup.ac.uk</u>.

If you have not achieved the grades that you were hoping for, please still submit your results as they will help us to guide you through the process to ensure that we provide you with the very best information, advice and guidance relevant to your individual situation. If you already have your GCSE results, please send these to us as soon as possible.

We ask that you submit your results no later than Friday 30th of August 2024.

Induction

During your induction period we will be exploring a range of different approaches to art and design. We'll be kicking off your studies with a week exploring how practicing artists develop ideas and collect visual experiments. In the second week we'll be getting you inducted to the practical studios at our Tavistock Place campus (including ceramics, glass and the darkrooms).

Induction trip to Dartmoor

On Tuesday in your first week we'll be heading out via coach onto Dartmoor to draw, paint, photograph and gather. We'll be heading out whatever the weather so be prepared with good sturdy shoes and a weather/rain proof coat. We'll be briefing you on this on your first day with us but should you have any questions regarding accessibility, please get in touch directly with the team to ensure we can support you.

Studio Fee

To support the costs of practical inductions, group trips and the end of year exhibition, we ask our students to pay a studio fee of $\underline{\text{£75.}}$ This studio fee does not include photocopying or individual project materials (outside of what is provided within the studio). What you'll need to start the year

Sketchbook (A4 - A3 depending on your personal preference) A lined journal (A5 - A4 depending on your personal preference) A basic pencil case of kit (Pencils, black pens (felt tip), ruler, scissors, eraser, sharpener, a couple of small paint brushes, masking tape) An A2 portfolio case (Something sturdy is preferred!)

Please make sure everything is labelled with your name.

Getting started over the Summer

We want you to have a break over the summer and spend time enjoying nature, friendships and experiences. However! If you are super keen to get started, we would recommend seeing as many exhibitions as you can. Also, begin looking more purposefully around you. Take a sketchbook with you wherever you go, document what you experience, not just what you see but what you hear, what you feel. Photograph interesting textures, collect objects which you find curious. This will be a personal project and get you thinking creatively ready for your first week with us.

This year, we are very proud to have been awarded **University of the Year for South West England** at the Whatuni Student Choice Awards (WUSCAs) by our students. We were also crowned as Winner for South West England in three additional categories: **Lecturers & Teaching Quality, Facilities and Student Support.** The nominees and winners of these unique awards are based on reviews submitted by students from across the UK, and winners are judged by a panel made up of prospective and current university students.

Our entry requirements

For Foundation Diploma we offer places to students who have an L3 qualification and a GCSE profile of at least 5 A*-C grades (or 9-4 in the grading scheme) including English and Maths and a combination of AS and A-Level qualifications (with one in a creative subject)

What should I do if I have achieved my predicted grades and have met the entry criteria for my course?

Congratulations! When you receive your results, please **forward the email, scan a copy or email a photo of your results to our Admissions team at <u>results@aup.ac.uk</u></u>, with your name clearly visible. Your results will then be processed and your offer will be changed to unconditional. You will receive an email confirming this has taken place over the following days.**

What should I do if I have not achieved my Level 3 Qualifications?

Don't worry! Every student is different and in the current climate, not everyone is going to be able to achieve what they had been hoping for - we understand this!

When you receive your results, please forward the email, scan a copy or email a photo of your results to our Admissions team at <u>results@aup.ac.uk</u> who will pass your results onto our Foundation Diploma team. We will look at each student individually and be in contact with you to discuss the best study programme options and what we feel the best fit is for you.

Before you start

You will be sent (to the email address that you used to apply with) details of how to access your new **Arts University Plymouth IT account**. In here, you will find details on how to complete your online enrolment this must be done before you arrive on 6th September. **We will be contacting you on your university email address with all future important information**.

As part of our enrolment process, **you may be required to take online assessments in English and Maths**, to help us understand your strengths and abilities in these two key subjects. Logging into your new Arts University Plymouth email account will take you to links to your English and Maths initial assessment.
