What to expect at Arts University Plymouth

Your timetable is likely to include a combination of on-campus studio practice, practical projects, experimentation and development of production work, technical workshops and online interactive lectures, seminars, small group tutorials, 1:1 tutorials, crits, studio briefs and much more. In a typical week you will be allocated time on campus for practice based teaching, seminars, technical delivery, making and experimentation, as well as time for self-initiated and self-directed practice as part of our extended studio model. You will be able to book into our studios, IT Suites and baserooms to make work, as well as engage in Workshop Wednesdays and book technical support from our technical teams.

Certain unit titles and their content have changed this year including unit 701 - Practice-led Research Methods, 702 - Creative and Critical Development and 703 - Independent Final Project. Unit 701 provides a means for students to put their research into action through their chosen selection of small units of learning that expand their knowledge and understanding of their respective subject.

Access to our world-class spaces to make

Arts University Plymouth is widely regarded as a catalyst for individual, societal and ecological transformation, continually striving to deliver innovative and distinctive learning, teaching and research through a unique interdisciplinary ecosystem of materials, processes, technologies and knowledge exchange. All of this is wrapped within a city that is brimming with creative confidence and cultural opportunities, nestled between the wild beauty of the Atlantic Ocean and Dartmoor.

When you start in September, you will have access to group teaching with academics and highly-skilled technical demonstrators within industry-standard workshop and studio spaces, alongside live video-based lectures, tutorials, one-to-one activities and integrated offline learning. Our main Tavistock Place campus is open six days a week (term time only) from 8:30am until 8pm Monday to Thursday, 6pm Friday and 2pm on Saturdays. Outside of term time, the campus is open 8:30 until 6pm, Monday to Friday.
